The hydroxyl radical can also be produced during CYP-catalyzed hepatic microsomal oxidative reactions (see Section 4). Somatic mutations are not inherited by an organism's offspring because they do not affect the germline. However, they are passed down to all the progeny of a mutated cell within the same organism during mitosis. A major section of an organism therefore might carry the same mutation.
