Oxygen therapy is the term we use for the clinical use of supplemental oxygen. It's indicated in patients with acute hypoxemia (PaO₂ less than 60 mm Hg or SaO₂ less than 90%) and those with symptoms of chronic hypoxemia or increased cardiopulmonary workload. Oxygen is also given to help with the removal of foculated air in the chest, as you would see with pneumothorax or pneumomediastinum.

Penetrating trauma is an injury that occurs when an object pierces the skin and enters a tissue of the body, creating an open wound. Thiabendazole is a benzimidazole derivative with anthelmintic property. Although the mechanism of action has not been fully elucidated, thiabendazole inhibits the helminth-specific mitochondrial enzyme fumarate reductase, thereby inhibiting the citric acid cycle, mitochondrial respiration and subsequent production of ATP, ultimately leading to helminth's death.
